



#### WHY DID YOU WRITE THIS BOOK?

I started writing Half In a way to get over the death of the first love of my life. It was for therapy, not publication. On a whim I entered it into a first chapter writing contest. When I won I thought, "Maybe there's something here."

#### GIVE US A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF THE BOOK.

The memoir looks back at the secret love affair I had with my boss just after college when I was 23 and she was 57. It's also about me trying figuring out what to do with my life in the real world.

#### WHAT WAS THE MOST CHALLENGING PART OF WRITING THE BOOK?

Finishing it. I worked on this book, off and on, for almost 18 years. It wasn't the writing process that kept me from finishing it, it was the healing one. I wasn't ready to share my story.

Cohen first met Sarah when she was still a closeted undergraduate with dreams of one day being a writer. The author took a summer job on campus as a counselor helping to orient incoming students. Sarah was her boss, a hard-nosed woman in her 50s who quickly took a shine to Cohen and the author worked hard to impress her. After graduation, Cohen found a job in admissions and remained on campus, continuing to run into Sarah now and then. The connection between the two was enough to draw the attention of the author's first girlfriend, who commented on the impropriety of Sarah being attracted to a woman one-third her age. The attraction, though, was mutual. "That night I woke from a dream in which Sarah showed up at my apartment, told me her girlfriend had left her, and kissed me," writes Cohen, "I tried falling back to sleep, but my brain was hellbent on replaying the dream." Eventually, the two acted on their desires despite Sarah's long-term relationship with a woman named Linda. But the secret could only stay hidden for so long, and when the truth of their love became public, the author was forced to live with the consequences of her affair. Cohen's prose is simple but urgent, capturing the passion and confusion of her emotions: "Fifteen minutes later Sarah pulled into the driveway at my parents' house. It was pitch black out, the sky full of stars. The air smelled cold like snow was coming. I shuddered...Sarah was about to meet my parents who thought they would be meeting my former boss, not my current lover." The book moves quickly, and the author proves a sympathetic protagonist even when she recounts decisions

that readers will likely wish she hadn't made. It's a compelling scenario, one that feels transgressive to both the writer and readers, and Cohen holds her audience's attention to the end.

When Cohen was a twenty-three-year-old recent college graduate, she faced her future with uncertainty. She hoped to become a full-time professional writer, as well as to write a book about how her grandfather survived the Holocaust as a gift for him. But she also knew that she needed time to discover who she really was, instead of who she was expected to be. Getting a counseling job at her alma mater bought her that time. It also brought her an unexpected, life-changing love story, one made possible by secrets and lies: Cohen fell in love with her boss, Sarah, an imposing woman who was thirty-four years her senior. The growing attraction between the women was undeniable, despite Sarah's long-term relationship with her partner. Linda, and the consequences that their discovery could have on their

Cohen's story is multifaceted, emotive, and complex. She writes that her new relationship challenged her fragile and developing self-image, even as it ignited her passion. Time to move on. Time to fall in love again."
